## DTV Consumer Education Quarterly Activity Report

### Instructions

This form should be used to provide the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) with information pertaining to all station activity to educate consumers on the transition to digital television (DTV). All stations should log DTV Transition-Related Public Service Announcements (PSAs) and other DTV activities using the appropriate house (identification) numbers. This form must continue to be filed for each quarter in which a station has DTV Transition education obligations.

On its analog channel, and its primary digital stream, a station must air one transition PSA, and run one transition crawl, in every quarter of every day. This requirement will increase to two PSAs and crawls per quarter per day on April 1, 2008, and to three of each on October 1, 2008. Stations are required to air PSAs or crawls at various times in any given day part, and at least one PSA and one crawl per day must be run during primetime hours. On-air education must not contain inaccurate or misleading statements and must be provided in the same language as a majority of the programming carried by the station. PSAs must be at least 15 seconds, and closed-captioned. Crawls must run during programming for no fewer than 60 consecutive seconds across the bottom or top of the viewing area (See rules for additional details).

Digital Transition Progress:

The public – especially in Southeast Michigan – is getting the message that they need to act to be sure they keep getting over-the-air broadcasts with the transition to digital by February 17, 2009.

WTVS Detroit Public Television has run three separate spots a total of 253 times between Jan. 1 and March 31, 2008.

People in Michigan and Southeast Michigan are outpacing national averages in requesting the \$40 coupons from [www.dtv2009.gov](http://www.dtv2009.gov) or 1-888-DTV-2009.

Nearly 5% of all requests for the coupons have come from Michigan, though we have only 3% of the nation's population.

At this point (April 7, 2008), out of 50 states, only California, Texas, Illinois, Pennsylvania, and Ohio residents have requested more coupons than Michigianians have.

Nearly half of the Michigan requests came from Southeast Michigan ZIP codes. We and our commercial TV colleagues are working hard to get the word out and answer viewer questions, and it is paying off.
